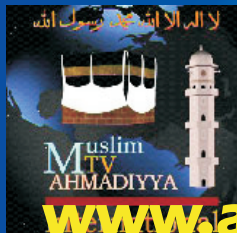

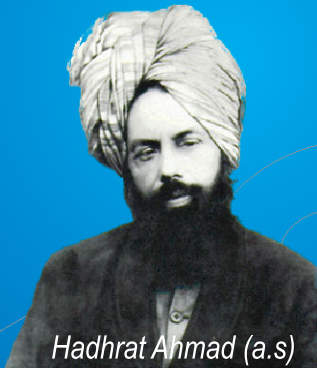

# OUR SPONSOR

He perceives religion as a positive force that has global potential for fostering international peace by bringing people and communities together. Dr. Rahman has addressed many public forums on a variety of social and religious issues.
