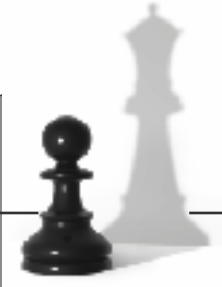

The Ahmadiyya Muslim Community is a religious organization, international in its scope, with members in over 190 countries. This is the most dynamic denomination of Islam in modern history, with worldwide membership exceeding tens of millions.

The Ahmadiyya Community was established in 1889 by Hadhrat Mirza Ghulam Ahmad (1835-1908) in a small and remote village, Qadian, India.

He claimed to be the reformer of the latter days, the Awaited One of the world community of religions (the Mahdi & Messiah).

The Community is an embodiment of the benevolent message of Islam-peace, universal brotherhood, and submission to the Will of God in its pristine purity.

The Ahmadiyya Muslim Community in Islam was created under divine guidance with the objective to rejuvenate Islamic moral and spiritual values.

It encourages interfaith dialogue, provides information to remove misunderstandings about Islam. It advocates peace, tolerance, love and understanding among followers of different faiths. It firmly believes in and acts upon the Qur'anic teaching: "There is no compulsion in religion." (2:257). It strongly rejects violence and terrorism in any form and for any reason. Ahmadiyya Muslim Community has been holding many Interfaith Symposia and Conferences across Canada. The Community firmly believes and always promotes its famous slogan;

David Perlich is the Program Manager at CBC Radio in Calgary. He grew up on a farm in Southern Alberta. After studying with the Jesuits at Gonzaga University in the US and in Italy, David spent last 17 years as journalist. He worked as war correspondent in Bosnia & Croatia in 93-94, and then spent time in Turkey, Israel, Netherlands & Austria, before returning to Canada. In 97 David rejoined CBC TV, and eventually became Producer of the program Moral Divide, CBC Newsworld's national ethical debate program. Since then David has help co-ordinate the CBC's coverage of John Paul II's visit to Canada, and then worked in Rome as a producer & correspondent for JP II's funeral and the election of Benedict the XVI.

Mr. Naseem Mahdi (Representing Islam)

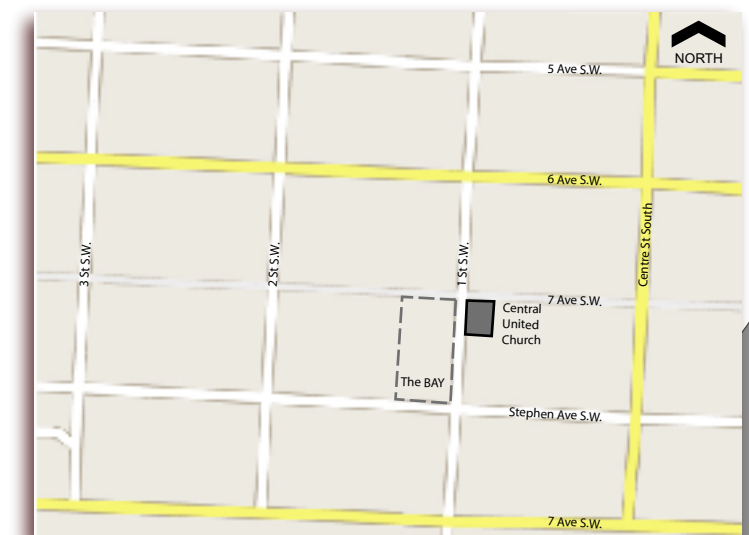
