Eileen serves at Presbytery on Staff Committee, does Pastoral Care at the Earl of March Secondary School and volunteers at the Queensway Carleton Hospital with their Peri-Natal Bereavement Response Team.

Rev. Barry Goodwin was ordained in 1969 and has served in a variety of ministry settings in Quebec and Ontario. He also serves as a member of the Interim Ministry Network (IMN), Professional Development committee and in 2005 received the Professional Transitional Specialist designation by IMN.
