MODERATOR



Dr. John Osborne is a medievalist and cultural historian, with a special focus on the cities of Rome and Venice in the period between the sixth and thirteenth centuries. He is particularly interested in issues of cross-cultural contact between the European, Byzantine and Muslim worlds.

A graduate of Carleton University, the University of Toronto, and the University of London, he has held faculty and administrative positions at the University of Victoria (1979-2001) and Queen's University (2001-2005), and is currently Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences at Carleton.

ISLAM



Mr. Ataul Wahid LaHaye became a member of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community in March of 1984 after studying various religious doctrines for 8 years. He sat on the National Executive of the Ahmadiyya Community Canada for 7 years and has lectured on various religious subjects in Canada, Britain and the United States.

He has been producing documentaries on behalf of the Ahmadiyya Community for several years. A few of his documentaries include:

"Qadian" (the home of the founder of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community),
"Jesus in India"
"A Sign for North America" and
"A Heavenly Sign".

He is currently working on a documentary that will examine male/female relationships in the context of dating.

JUDAISM



Rabbi Arnold Fine is a Community Chaplain with Jewish Family Services, the social services agency of the Ottawa Jewish Federation. Prior to this, he has been an executive director at the Associated Synagogues of Massachusetts, a rabbi at Agudath Israel Congregation and interim rabbi at Beth Shalom Congregation. He was a rabbi and principal at Tree of Life Congregation from 1966 to 1968.

Mr. Fine received his Bachelor of Arts degree with Honours from Clark University in 1960 and his Masters degree in Hebrew Literature from Jewish Theological Seminary in 1964.

Mr. Fine is affiliated with several communities including Rabbinical Assembly, Ontario Region of the Rabbinical Assembly, and Chair of Pastoral Care committees.

CHRISTIANITY



Dr. Tom Sherwood is an ordained United Church minister who has served as Ecumenical Chaplain at Carleton University since 1999. He is also an Adjunct Professor of Sociology of Religion at Carleton.

He is a graduate of York University (B.A.), University of Toronto (M.Div.), and Carleton (M.A. and Ph.D.). In Ottawa, he is a founding member of three interfaith organizations, and for many years has been co-chair of the Jewish-Christian Dialogue of the National Capital Area.

He has also written a regular column for the Ottawa Citizen (1987-91), hosted a weekly radio program (1982-90), and been hired as a consultant to government departments, cabinet ministers and NGOs on issues of social policy.
