33rd Ahmadiyya Annual Convention concludes - Many Dignitaries and over 15,000 Delegates attended

MISSISSAUGA: The three-day, 33rd Annual Convention of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community concluded on June 28, 2009 with representation from all levels of government, members of the media and over fifteen thousand delegates from Canada

On the final day of the conference, Mr. Farhan Khokhar, the National Communications Director of Canada's Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, spoke of the future of Islam in the West. He contemplated that West will only accept the peaceful interpretation of Islam. Based on the Holy Qur'an, he elaborated on the teachings of, Jihad, Islamic model of governance, freedom of conscience and loyalty to the country.
